As we close 2024, the City of Tallahassee's bicentennial year, we celebrate our remarkable achievements and reflect on 200 years of rich history, growth and community spirit. From vibrant

cultural events to impactful projects

that enhanced infrastructure and quality of life, this milestone year showcased the best of Tallahassee.

We tackled new challenges innovation with and resilience, consistently delivering best-in-class services, even in the face of unprecedented events and natural disasters. When the City was hit by tornadoes in May, destruction to our electric grid was extensive with over 500 broken poles and 325 damaged transformers, leaving more than 80,000 customers without power and requiring a complete rebuild of significant portions of the system. Within just two days, the City had restored 91% of the electric grid.

This bicentennial year also marks the final year of the 2020-2024 strategic plan. Over 90% of current strategic plan targets have been completed. Using the strategic plan

as a guide, the City's focused efforts, including significant investments in its infrastructure, have created a robust economic environment, promoting smart growth and development that attracts businesses and investors. As a result, Tallahassee has the Strongest Economy in the U.S. according to Area

Development, a national site-selection industry magazine.

The City made progress this year on transformative projects that will enhance economic, educational, and leisure opportunities, as well as safety, for residents. Construction projects underway include the international processing facility at Tallahassee International Airport, the Southside Transit Center, second senior center and headquarters for the Tallahassee Police Department, to name a
